Dear Parents and Carers,

This afternoon, we are having our Summer Fair - I hope you're coming to join us! A huge thank you to everyone who has helped in the run up and who will be manning the stalls and clearing up afterwards. The Friends have done a wonderful job for us this year, hosting events for the children and their families, as well as raising money to help us pay for our new library and subsidising school trips for every child in the school. Early on Tuesday morning, I downloaded the Y6 children's SATs results and spent the day analysing them. I am pleased to say that they have done themselves and their teachers proud despite the level of difficulty in the tests now. The children are no longer awarded levels but instead get a scaled score with 100 being the mark for achieving the expected standard. Results will be included on the Y6 reports when they come out next Friday and the headline figures will be available for everyone to view on the school's website following that.

I spent Wednesday and Thursday this week meeting with each class teacher and Mrs Wood to review the progress of every child in school. We have already begun to make plans for September for how we address any slow progress or support children who have found certain bits of the curriculum difficult. Of course, teachers can only do so much and that is why we also include Next Steps on our reports so that you and your child can also do your bit to ensure that everyone makes the progress they should and achieves their potential. You will receive your child's annual report next Friday afternoon, so please look out for the brown envelop in your child's bag!

There are a number of further events for each yeargroup over the next week and a half: Y6 perform their summer play on Monday and Tuesday; Y5 have a Master Class day at Beaufort on Tuesday; the Reading Challenge winners enjoy their treat on Wednesday while everyone else has a lovely curriculum activity to look forward to - I hear that Y5 are going to be enjoying a French cafe, so maybe I'll pop along too; Y4 have their Roman Day on Thursday - togas may well be the costume of choice considering the heat; and on Friday everyone gets to meet their new classteacher for the afternoon.




Year Group News



Year 3

In Literacy, the children have been publishing their spooky stories and in Art, they are starting to design a front cover for it. In Numeracy, the children have been practising their times tables and discussing money. They looked at different money word problems and discussed how it was related to the real world. They investigated shadows in relation to the position of the sun, the distance the object is from the light source and the effect of the shadow and how different objects create different shadows.

Year 4

The children evaluated a range of different products, before deciding on their own design. Their designs included snappy slogans, beautiful, vibrant pictures and cooking instructions. These will be very useful when the children make their pizzas next week. On Thursday 12th and Friday 13th, the children were invited over to Beaufort to participate in some technology activities. Just a reminder, next Thursday (19th July) is our Roman day. The children can dress up in Roman costumes and bring a tent. Thank you for your support with this and we hope the sessions were useful in alleviating any difficult conversations. We are very much looking forward to our visit to Beaufort Academy next week. You should have received a letter concerning this. **Homework** is to compile a personal Fact File to give to the new Year 6 Class teacher next Friday when the children will be visiting their new classes.

Year 6

We have been extremely busy preparing for the end of year production - thank you to the children who spent the time learning their lines and for delivering them with gusto. It is coming together really well and we are now well prepared for our performances next year. In literacy, we have been writing about our memories of Harewood. The children have been trying to show off their writing skills, whilst enjoying reminiscing about the last four years. They've been coming together really nicely and it has been lovely to hear about their memories. In numeracy, we have been completing our board games based on a chosen area of mathematics. We have been looking at transitioning to secondary school in PSHE, looking at worries and concerns, as well as how to deal with a range of different scenarios that the children may face. In science, we have continued to look at the adaptations of animals. We created our own new animals and found out how well they could survive in the habitat of the classroom. In P.E., each class has continued to learn and develop their skills in athletics, cricket or rounders.
